

ROCKY MOTORCYCLE CLUB RACE RULES AND REGULATIONS

General Rules

1. All racers must be Rocky Motorcycle Club members and have signed the waiver provided to the Club by the County of Clearwater (landowner).
2. No rider under the age of 18 may compete without notarized consent of his/her parents or legal guardian.
3. All race personnel, race organizers, promoters, officials, riders, mechanics, anyone associated with riders and photographers must not consume or be under the influence of intoxicants or drugs that could affect their normal mental or physical ability. Besides affecting the safety of the event, any such use is inconsistent with the concept of good sportsmanship and is harmful to the sport of motorcycling.
4. All riders and other race personnel must assess for themselves the track, facilities existing conditions and other matters relating to safety.

Riders and Classifications

1. Rider classes are set out by the Rocky Motorcycle Club with the understanding that the rider will put themselves in their ability appropriate class. If the Rocky Motorcycle Club executive feels a rider has put themselves in a class above their ability it will be discussed with the rider and they will be put in a different class.
2. A rider must be 14 years of age or older to ride motorcycles above 250cc.
3. Capacity limits for the listed classes are permitted as follows:
Peewee A/B class - 0 - 50cc 2 stroke/0 - 73cc 4 stroke
Kids class - 60cc - 65cc 2 stroke/0 - 80cc 4 stroke
Youth class - 80cc - 105cc 2 stroke/100cc - 150cc 4 stroke
Ladies class - minimum 80cc 2 stroke/100cc 4 stroke
Exp, Int, Beg, Vet class - 125cc - 500cc 2 stroke/250cc - 550cc 4 stroke
ATV Mini class - 50cc - 125cc 2 and 4 stroke
ATV class - minimum 250cc 2 and 4 stroke

Entries

1. Entrants may be removed from an event for breaking the rules of conduct.
2. A rider must start the first moto to be considered a participant. No rider will be permitted to start the second moto unless they have participated in the first moto.

Safety

1. If the red flag is waved at any point once the race has started all riders must safely make their way back to the starting gate and the race will be restarted once the cause of the red flag has been cleared from the track.
2. If a rider is given the black flag they must leave the track at the spot that has been established as the exit for the track. The rider receiving the black flag is disqualified from the race due to conduct and will not be permitted to start the next moto.
3. If the yellow flag is being displayed by one or more flaggers, the riders must slow their pace and proceed with caution as there is a downed rider on the track. No jumps are to be completed in the area of the yellow flags, if a rider does complete a jump they will be docked five race positions upon completion of the race.

Points

1. Points will be awarded on the finishing position for each moto:

1st = 1 point

2nd = 2 points, etc.

Each riders overall finish will be determined by their total number of points received in all of the motos they participate in, with lowest total being the overall winner. A rider must complete at least half of the scheduled number of laps to receive points for that moto. In the case of a tie in overall points the rider with the higher placing in the last moto will receive the higher overall finish position.

2. Any grievances must be presented in writing within thirty minutes of results being posted.
